Several times my toddler and his grandmother have been jumped on by dogs on Balderton park (Coronation Street Park). Thankfully it appears they have been playful, but nonetheless it has left them both frightened on multiple occasions because the dogs have been trying to jump on them and knocking my toddler, with their owners too far away to do anything. I'm not aware that there is lead policy on the park, but I would like to request that a dogs-on-leads only policy be enacted at the park. The park is so full of dogs which are not under any meaningful owner-control that it is becoming an exclusionary environment for those without them, and particularly smaller children. I have also spoken with dog-owners who have had problems on the park with other dog owners because of this. Please could this be looked at in light of what I've raised above, but also before something worse happens.
